The Young European Resuscitation Council – A catalyst for the next generation of the resuscitation community

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To the Editor.

In order to sustainably pursue the mission of the European Resuscitation Council (ERC) of 'preserving life by making high quality resuscitation available to all', ^{1,2} it is essential to build a strong next generation of resuscitation leaders. ³ Therefore, the Young ERC was founded in 2017 to support the growth of early-career members in the resuscitation community. ⁴ The foundation of the Young ERC has been described previously. ⁴ Meanwhile, the Young ERC has taken significant steps by developing novel initiatives, providing continuous peer-engagement and extending its involvement in established ERC structures. ^{5–7} However, to prioritize future actions, it is important to understand the needs of early-career members. We aim to describe the results of the Young ERC survey and highlight recent initiatives and outline the vision for future priorities of the Young ERC.

The Young ERC survey was conducted as an online survey among Young ERC newsletter recipients and social media followers between November 2022 and April 2023. The survey comprised 24 questions, including two open-ended questions, assessing respondent demographics and perceptions of current and future Young ERC activities. We obtained 91 responses from survey participants of those 68 (75%) identified as male, 76 (84%) were between 18 and 39 years old, and 76 (84%) resided in a European country. Pri-

mary occupation was as follows: 42 (46%) physicians, 23 (25%) students, 12 (13%) paramedics or emergency medical technicians, 6 (7%) nurses and 8 (9%) other professions. When asking about future priorities for Young ERC initiatives 67 (74%) of respondents indicated that the development of a resuscitation science masterclass was important to them. Additionally, the development of a mentorship program and networking initiatives was ranked as important by 60 (66%) and 72 (79%) of respondents, respectively.




Fig. 1 – Overview Young European Resuscitation Council contributions. Abbreviations: European Resuscitation Council (ERC), Future Innovations in Resuscitation Science and Technology (F.I.R.S.T.).

Based on the results, the Young ERC has developed several initiatives. In September 2023 we piloted the Resuscitation Science Masterclass to provide training and networking opportunities for future resuscitation scientists. With the support from the ERC Board, individual resuscitation science experts and Resuscitation Plus, we will continue the masterclass in 2024 with plans for further expansion of this initiative in the future. Further, a mentoring project is under development designed to address the specific needs of early-career individuals. The range of activities and initiatives that the Young ERC has launched in collaboration with the ERC and Resuscitation Plus are described in Fig. 1.

Going forward, the Young ERC Committee will expand its effort to support early-career individuals globally by scaling up existing Young ERC projects and by developing novel initiatives that enable active participation. Furthermore, the Young ERC Committee will work

towards building a productive network with the existing National Resuscitation Councils' early-career groups and support the formation of such groups on a national level to facilitate early integration of trainees and students into the larger ERC community. Overall, the Young ERC aspires to serve as a catalyst for the next generation of the resuscitation community which may support the continuous and sustainable advancement of resuscitation science and practice.
