## **ERRATUM**

Re: Volume 4, Number 1. In the article entitled "Amplitude-Induction Gradient of a Small Human Operant in an Escape-Avoidance Situation," by Ralph F. Hefferline and Brian Keenan, the fifth paragraph down on page 43 was printed incorrectly. This paragraph should read as follows:

When the subject was asked later to state what he had done to obtain reinforcement, his report suggested superstitious behavior based on knowledge of electrode placement: one on each hand and ankle and one on an earlobe.
