Author's Note. There were 2 errors in the data used for the analysis in this paper. (1) The effective dates for the Anderson County, Redding County, and Shasta County smoke-free bar ordinances were stated to be February 1993. A tobacco industryinspired referendum delayed the effective dates of these ordinances until July 1993. (2) The Santa Clara County and Shasta County ordinances apply to the unincorporated areas of these counties; the data used in the original paper were for the entire counties, not just the unincorporated areas. (The data for the unincorporated areas are available from 1991 through 1996.) The revised Table 4, which follows, presents the results of the analysis after correction for these errors. The paper's conclusion that smokefree bar ordinances do not affect bar revenues is unchanged.
