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# Erratum to: Severely deranged vital signs as triggers for acute treatment modifications on an intensive care unit in a low-income country

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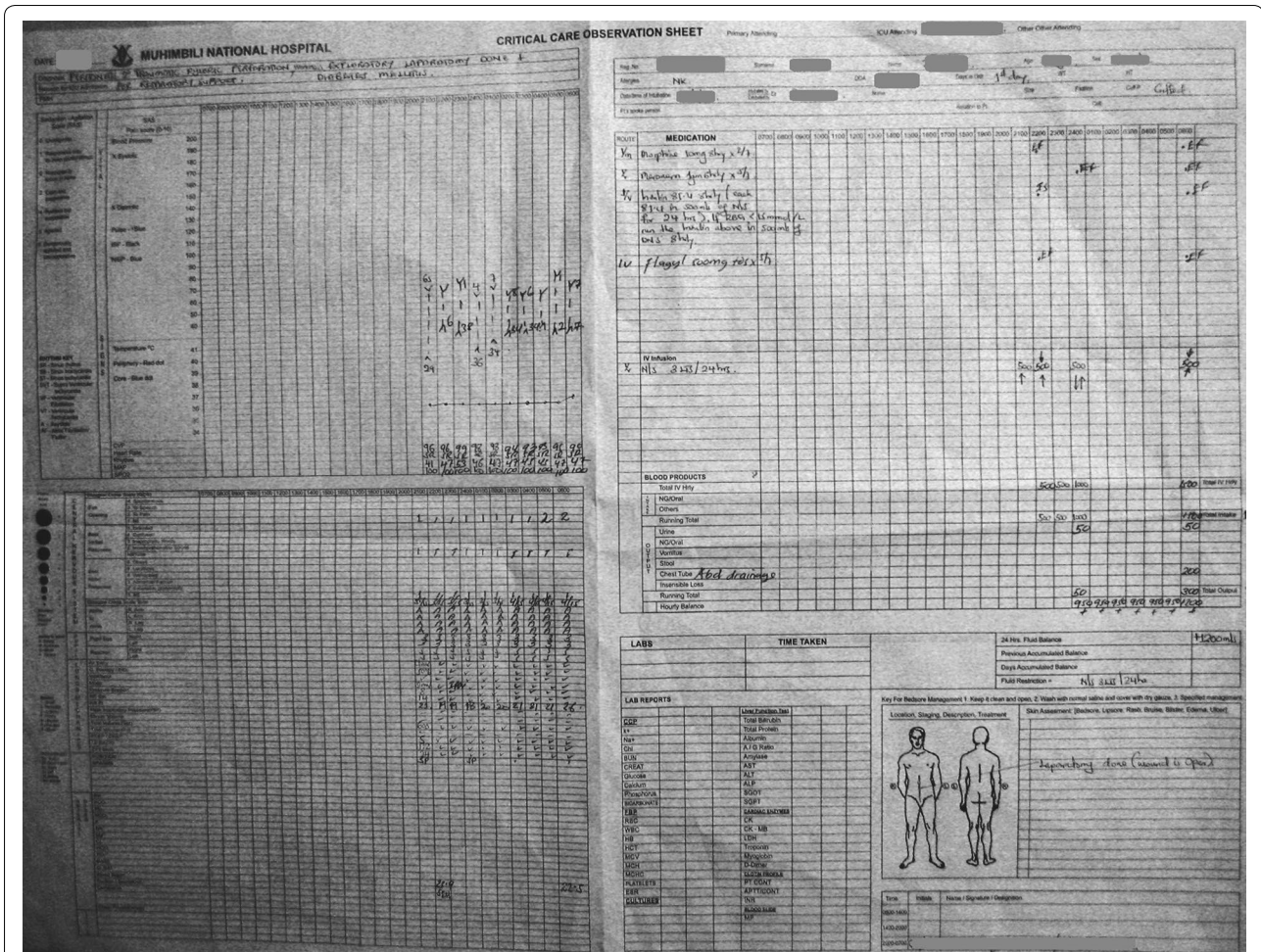
**Erratum to: BMC Res Notes (2015) 8:313**
