## Life sciences study design

Sample size	Sample size of 4 was selected as an appropriate trade-off between statistical power and experimental feasibility, taking into consideration the number of treatments and available time and costs. This was not based on statistical pre-analysis, but is a standard choice for this field.
Data exclusions	Two samples were lost in the course of laboratory preparations: One replicate for TAG determination (high-C, no nutrient treatment at 96 hours) and one replicate for PHB (low-C, with nutrient at 96 hours).
Replication	The applied methods are well established in the laboratory and known to be reproducible from previous validation. All measurements were accompanied by analysis of appropriate standards, which were confirmed to be within acceptable bounds of quantification. Further sources of variability between measurements are captured in the variability between replicates and therefore accounted for in the uncertainty estimates of results.
Randomization	Starting soil material was sieved and homogenized before distributing into microcosms, and these microcosms were randomly assigned to treatment groups.
Blinding	Blinding was not applied. Experimenters were only responsible for routine laboratory procedures, with all measurements performed by laboratory instruments (e.g. GC-MS).
