


Appendix B - Figure 1: Country Demographics of Survey Respondents (79 countries)




Appendix B - Figure 2: Country Demographics of Survey Respondents (Top 10 countries)






Appendix B - Figure 3: Hierarchical Representation of The Form of Violence Faced by Survey Respondent – Self v/s Colleague
