Clinician Demographics	<p>What is your base speciality?</p> <p>How many years' experience do you have as a pre-hospital consultant?</p>
Introduction	<p>I would like you to consider your approach to how you assess, and decide treatments for, trauma patients you see in your pre-hospital clinical role. I'm going to ask you about bleeding. Would that be alright?</p>
