



**Supplemental Figure 1. *Meth Free LA County* campaign materials used as study stimuli in 2021 cross-sectional survey**

Stimuli	Description & Visuals
<p>“Behind the Face” video advertisement</p>	 <p>The video begins with a young man wearing visual effects makeup representing the stereotype of what a meth user looks like. As he removes the makeup, he challenges the viewer’s belief that people who use meth can be easily identified by their appearance, instead sharing early warning signs of meth use such as paranoia, aggression, and hallucinations. Fresh-faced, he tells viewers that someone in their lives struggling with meth could look just like him, or one of the other diverse adults who joins him. The video ends with the line, “There is hope and help at MethFreeLACounty.org.”</p>
<p>“Turn on the Light” video advertisement</p>	

	<p>A young man who has used meth is dancing in a nightclub while the narrator describes how meth has already begun damaging his body from the first hit, even if he is not aware of it. As the partying environment sours, the narrator explains how meth cuts off oxygen to the skin and permanently impairs brain function long before causing the sorts of physical effects typically associated with meth use. The video ends with the line, “There is hope and help at MethFreeLACounty.org.”</p>

Radio stimuli (English)	<p><b>Ad 1:</b>  JAIME: What do you picture if you think of a meth user? If you only imagined a person with sores or damaged teeth, you'd be wrong. The reality is, long before you can SEE any physical effects, meth is destroying a new user's BRAIN. So what you should be looking for are signs like paranoia, aggression and hallucinations. Look past the stereotype. Because someone struggling with meth, could look like anyone.</p> <p>ANNOUNCER: There is hope and help at MethFreeLACounty.org.
