

## Glossary of Terms

Term	Definition
Behavioral health	Includes mental health and substance use disorders. As a discipline, encompasses a continuum of prevention, intervention, treatment, and recovery support services
Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic	Government designated entities that provide a comprehensive array of services that create access, stabilize people in crisis, and provide necessary treatment for patients with complex mental illnesses and addiction disorders
Community Mental Health Program	In Oregon, an entity that is responsible for planning and delivery of a variety of clinical and rehabilitative safety net services for individuals with mental health diagnoses or addiction disorders. Operates in a specific geographic area under contract with the Oregon Health Authority or a local mental health authority
Federally Qualified Health Center	Government designated safety net entities that provide a comprehensive array of primarily outpatient services. Must meet certain requirements to qualify and receive funding and/or enhanced Medicaid reimbursement
Non-profit association	Statewide non-profit focused on advocacy with professional representation across a range of disciplines, work settings, and geographic locations
Peer-delivered services	Community-based services and supports provided by peer providers to individuals with similar lived experience. Intended to support individuals to engage in ongoing treatment and to live successfully in the community
Provider	An individual who delivers services, as opposed to agencies or group practices
Public behavioral health system	System that is funded in part or in full through public financing such as Medicaid, or local, state, or federal grants. Includes community health clinics, community-based organizations, schools, jails, and other entities
Recovery-support non-profit	Community-based non-profit that provides peer-delivered services, various wellness programs, recovery support, and drop-in centers. Often dependent on philanthropic or grant funding as opposed to reimbursement for clinical services
Serious mental illness	A mental, behavioral, or emotional disorder causing serious functional impairment. May include schizophrenia and schizoaffective disorder, bipolar disorder, and major depressive disorder.
