CHRONIC SUPPURATIVE LUNG DISEASE AND BRONCHIECTASIS IN CHILDREN, ADOLESCENTS AND ADULTS IN AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND

Thoracic Society of Australia and New Zealand (TSANZ) Position Statement

Bronchiectasis is an *important but* neglected chronic pulmonary disorder.

Objectives of our updated position statement are to:

- Increase awareness of the disease burden;
- 2. Encourage earlier and improved diagnosis and best-practice management;
- 3. Present an updated multi-disciplinary position statement on management of bronchiectasis.

A series of statements was generated, informed by literature searches. These were supported by 47 other health experts as part of a Delphi process.

The **33 statements** addressed the following broad categories:

- Awareness and diagnosis including paediatric-specific criteria
- Baseline tests for aetiology and severity
- Management
 - Antibiotics
 - Airway clearance techniques
 - Pulmonary rehabilitation
- Monitoring
 - Microbiology, disease
 - Co-morbidities
- > General wellbeing
- ➤ Health services, including those for under-serviced communities

The TSANZ statements seek to achieve the patient-oriented goals of:

- Preserving lung function
 - Halting disease progression
- Optimising QoL
- Reducing exacerbations
- Preventing complications

And in children and adolescents also:

- Optimising lung growth
- Reversing mild bronchiectasis
