

We obtained CO public lands shapefiles from publicly-available GIS data of Colorado Parks and Wildlife property boundaries

and Bureau of Land Management lands (<https://gbp-blm-egis.hub.arcgis.com/pages/colorado>).

We combined public lands for Colorado and Kansas, including Cimarron and Comanche National Grasslands boundaries, into one shapefile and used the resulting public lands shapefile to create a “private lands” USGS Land Change Monitoring, Assessment, and Projection (LCMAP) raster.

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
