Appendix 1

Questionnaire - Definition of terms

PATIENT INFORMATION

Age (years)

Age is presented as complete years.

- Example: A 2 year and 6 months old cat is defined as a 2 year old cat.

Cats less than 1 year are defined as «less than 1 year».

1. CHARACTERISTICS OF THE CAT

1.3 Has the cat been rehomed (from cat shelter or between private homes)?

This does not include change of home before 6 months of age.

1.4 How will you describe the cat's personality?

Nervous

The cat is easily scared or irritated - jittery and shy.

Fearful

The cat will retract or hide also in less stressful situations (not likely to provoke most cats).

Aggressive

The cat shows signs of apparently unmotivated aggression. Hostile or destructive behaviour.

2. ENVIRONMENT

2.1 Does the cat have outdoor access

Indoor

Indoor only is defined as:

- The cat is confined to a life indoor only.
- The cat may have limited access to a balcony or similar restricted area.

Outdoor access

Outdoor access is defined as:

- The cat has access to outdoor areas where the cat may move around at will. Includes outdoor access through cat hatch/pet flap door or that the cat is let out by the owner regularly.

2.2 Type of living area?

Countryside

Shielded location, no close neighbours or traffic.

Small village

Outskirts, open settlement, limited traffic.

Suburbs

Urban area, moderate, but more concentrated settlement and traffic.

City

City area, densely populated, dense traffic.

2.3 Type of housing?

Detached or terraced

Self-explanatory

Apartment ground floor

Apartment at ground level

Apartment 1st floor or higher

Apartment with no outdoor access at ground level.

2.5 May the cat choose its own sleeping place?

May choose

The cat has a permanent place chosen by will, or may sleep anywhere in the house by its own choice

May not choose

The cat is confined to a cage or specific room at night or the presence of other cats/pets limits the areas available to the cat.

2.6 Is there a "core area" or place where the cat may hide or feel safe?

This is a place where the cat may feel totally safe and «lets the guard down». It does not necessarily mean that the cat is hidden. Typical is a place where the cat lies down flat or peacefully curled up to sleep.

3. OTHER PETS IN THE HOUSEHOLD

3.1 Are there additional pets in the home?

If YES there are 1 or more additional cats in the home"

Is the cat population stable?

A stable population is defined as no frequent change (< 1 cat in or out/year).

4. FOOD AND WATER

4.1 Type of food?

Chose one alternative if one type is used more than the others. Chose two alternatives if two types are used approximately 50/50.

4.2 Is type of food changed frequently?

More frequently than every third month. Means change of brand or main type of food.

\rightarrow If the cat is neutered

Has the cat received a specialized diet for neutered cats?

Chose "YES" if one of the following types of diet has been used.

Hills - Neutered cat, c/d, k/d, s/d, w/d

Eukanuba - Struvite Urinary Formula, Oxalate Urinary Formula

Specific - Neutered young, Adult Struvite Management

Royal Canine - Young s/o Stones & Weight, Mature s/o Weight & Kidney, Senior Kidney & Osteo,

Sterilised 37

5. LITTER BOX

5.5 How often is the litter box scoped clear of waste material?

Scoping out is defined as clearance of urine and feces as opposed to cleaning of the box which involves changing the sand as well.

6. NATURAL BEHAVIOUR

6.2 Is there a climbing post/elevated vantage point provided?

Defined as a place where the cat may rest and have an overview of its main area.
