"Outside of the VA, online-delivered ACT for chronic pain has been rapidly expanding and found to increase activity engagement, pain acceptance, sleep quality, and quality of life while decreasing pain-related distress, anxiety, and depressive symptoms [22, 23]. However, despite multiple studies on civilian populations suggesting online-delivered ACT can improve chronic pain [24, 25], targeted, web-based ACT therapy interventions for veterans have not been investigated. This is unfortunate given research suggesting that veterans with a range of mental and physical health conditions are interested in mobile interventions [26]. In addition, although digital health programs are increasingly popular and efficacious, sustained engagement in online interventions tend to be poor for these at-home treatments [27]."

"Following initial development and usability testing of the intervention, and consistent with the recommended NIH stage model for development of behavioral therapies [31], we conducted a pilot feasibility randomized controlled trial (RCT) to assess the feasibility and acceptability of VACT-CP (n=20) compared to a waitlist and treatment as usual control group (WL + TAU; n = 22). We examined the following study aims:

1. Primary Aim. Assess the feasibility, usability, and acceptability of VACT-CP and a WL+TAU comparison condition, including ease of recruitment, attrition and retention in each condition, sustained VACT-CP website use, treatment receptivity, and the assessment process.
3. Secondary Aim. Describe changes in pain acceptance, valued living, mental and physical functioning, pain-related interference in daily functioning, and behavioral avoidance among participants in each treatment condition."
