"Summer Days" is reminiscent of my days as a youngster growing up in a family that loved to fish. Fishing is one of the ultimate forms of relaxation. A soft summer breeze, the lull of the waves lapping the shore, the warmth of the sun kissing your face and the quiet solitude allow you to drift and fantasize about a more peaceful and perfect world. In "Summer Days," texture plays an intricate part. Although clearly a balance between abstraction and realism, the tree line in the fading distance and the waves of the water evoke a feeling of the rugged shoreline and the soft grass underfoot.

"Most of my figures are void of an eye and nose, thus challenging the perceptive viewer to determine the subject's personality by the position of its posture, the slight tilt of the head, seemingly direct gaze and sometimes joyful movement or expressive mouth," Shannon-Young says.

Born in Kansas City, KS but having left while still an infant, Diana was reared mainly in California. She has been the proud owner of four separate galleries in California. Diana is an artist, art consultant and art investment workshop presenter now residing in Riverside, CA. Her work as an artist has earned her recognition and accolades.

Some academic training but primarily self-taught, she sold her first painting more than 25 years ago. A favorite among serious collectors and with numerous commissions, she was selected in 2004 to do the painting "Every Vote Counts" for The Congressional Black Caucus Foundation, Washington, DC, for its official conference poster.
