- 2. Where do you have Internet access that you use most frequently for personal use?
- 3. On average, how many days per week do you access the Internet for personal use?
- 4. Prior to your recent clinic visit, had you ever used the Internet to find information about health?
- 5. Do you have favorite Internet sources for health information?
- 6. Have you ever discussed any health information you read on the Internet during a clinic visit with your health care provider?
- 7. Have you recently discussed any health information you read in a magazine or newspaper, heard on the radio, or saw on television with a health care provider?
- 8. What health information did you receive at your recent clinic visit?
- 9. From the health information sources you received during your recent clinic visit, which one did you find most helpful?
- 10. Have you heard of MedlinePlus, a health information website?
- 11. Have you ever used MedlinePlus?
- 12. What is the highest level of education you have completed?

Intervention patient survey questions

All of the above questions except number 7, plus:

- 3. If you did not click on any of the links, please tell us the most likely reason.

- 5. How did you use (or do you plan to use) the information in the Health Information Prescription?
- 6. Were you satisfied with the quality of information found on the MedlinePlus website?
- 7. How likely are you to use MedlinePlus again?
- 8. Would you like to receive a Health Information Prescription following future clinic visits?
