Study Population

Exclusion criteria included factors that potentially affect lung or immune system development (e.g., maternal human immunodeficiency virus at delivery and newborn factors including significant congenital anomalies, pneumonia requiring antibiotic treatment for 1 week or more, and respiratory distress requiring either intubation and ventilation for 4 or more hours or supplemental oxygen or continuous positive airway pressure for 4 or more days). Between February 2005 and March 2007, 1853 families were screened, 779 met eligibility criteria, and 557 were enrolled(26). Table E1 shows maternal characteristics at screening by enrollment status; no significant differences were seen between the two groups based on sociodemographic factors, maternal asthma, or stress indices minimizing concern for selection bias.
