The principle components factor analysis with oblique (promax) rotation yielded a two-factor solution representing the domains of physical and sexual abuse (see Table IA). The number of factors retained was based on scree plots and factors with an eigenvalue > I per the Kaiser criteria. Items with factor loadings > 0.45 were assigned to the factor for which they had the greatest loading. For the childhood exposures and teen exposures the total percent variances explained by the two-factor solutions were 56% and 58%, respectively.

Categories that classify violence exposure by severity and chronicity were based on the factor analysis and frequency trends within each factor (see Table 2A). Physical abuse was classified by severity categories which incorporated both type of violence exposure and frequency of abuse. Sexual abuse was classified based on type of abuse and number of developmental periods that abuse was experienced (chronicity). Our cumulative violence measure merged both physical and sexual abuse.
