GENERAL COMMENTS	I think this paper is important because it provides information about systematic implementation of prevalent and corrective strategies - lacking or entirely haphazard in many facilities and jurisdictions. I found the germanic grammar somewhat distracting (I presume that that is what it is) and actually did a rough edit. I can mail through track changes to you if you wish.
	However, it could do with an edit to improve the colloquial English usage, remove "redundant qualifiers" and shorten the text.
