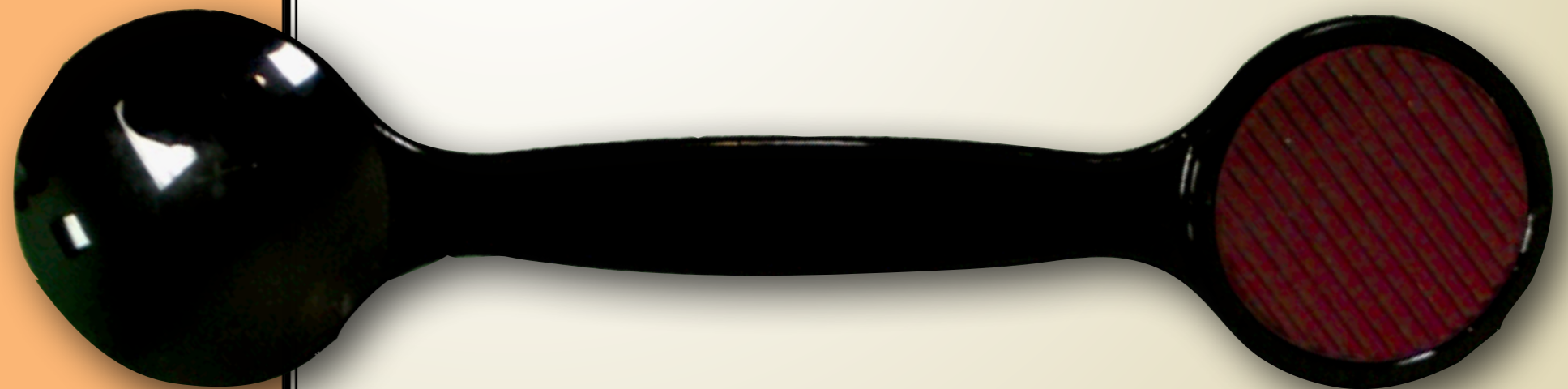
Then the doctor showed a chart with letters on it. I read all of the letters I could.
