

APPENDIX 1. MYASTHMA WORKFLOW

Parents were enrolled in MyAsthma onsite at their child's primary care practice. The parent accessed the parent interface of the MyAsthma portal online and initially recorded treatment goals and treatment concerns related to asthma, which were viewable by clinicians in the EHR via the clinician interface. Parents then completed an asthma control survey, the results of

which were recorded in a timeline on both the parent and clinician interfaces. The family and the practice both received the results of the survey and were given decision support based on the results; if poor control or side effects were entered, families were notified to call the practice and the practice was notified to contact families, either via a portal message or telephone encounter. If control was not poor and there were no side effects, parents were directed to continue fol-

lowing their child's asthma care plan. E-mail reminders were sent to families each month to remind them to complete the monthly control survey. Optional functions of MyAsthma included viewing patient education content (videos and handouts) and accessing their child's asthma care plan, a document generated in the office. Clinicians could recommend specific educational content to families via the portal and could view whether the family had viewed the content.


