

- Patient reported outcomes of people with diabetes show significant variation based on the patients socioeconomic status and personal health insurance coverage.
- Medicaid patients reported higher rates of disability, depression, and comorbidities than patients with Medicare or private insurance, as well as significant economic challenges resulting in difficulties treating their diabetes.
- Medicaid patients also report different ways of accessing information and different means of intervention than the other two groups
- In order to best serve this diverse population, these differences must be accounted for by those providing interventions to people with diabetes.
