APPENDIX: Composition of the Socio-Economic Status Index (SES-Index).

Table A1 shows the composition of the SES-Index score and the contribution of each risk factor to the composite score. Where there were missing data for highest educational qualification, mothers' age at leaving continuous education was used as a proxy measure. For occupation, the risk status of mothers who rated themselves as not in paid employment as a result of as looking after their family was coded using receipt of means-tested benefits as a proxy measure. A total SES-Index score was computed for each mother which was used to classify overall socio-economic risk as low, moderate and high.
