MANUAL CLEANING of INSTRUMENTS

THE PROBLEM

- Kits are being returned to the Dental Hospital with cement still contaminating instruments.
- CSSD do <u>not</u> carry out manual cleaning.



<u>WHY?</u>

- Cross infection risk
- Compromised patient care, and increased costs


Manually clean our instruments before returning them to the trolley

IT IS YOUR OWN RESPONSIBILITY TO CARRY THIS OUT.



Ensure you are wearing your personal protective equipment (glasses, mask and gloves)

Inspect all instruments in your kit for contamination after use.



If found, first use a detergent wipe, ensuring the wiping action is <u>in one direction</u> <u>only</u>, <u>away</u> from any part likely to pose a risk of a stick injury If cement still present, then hold the instrument so the tip <u>is in contact with the top</u> <u>of the bracket table</u>, then use a wooden spatula to remove the cement Wipe again with a detergent wipe, and re-inspect

If cement cannot be removed by this method, dispose of the instrument in a sharps bin
