Capacity building	The act of developing the processes, skills,
	activities, and resources needed for
	organisations to survive, adapt, and thrive in a
	fast-paced changing environment.
Adaptive capacity	The ability of a system to modify or transform
	its behaviour, in anticipation of and in
	response to change, to capitalise on
	opportunities for improvement.
Community-based organisation	Typically comprises non-government, not-for-
	profit organisations, representative of a
	community, that provide social, health, and
	welfare services to meet community needs.
Mechanism	Elements in the cognitive decision-making
	process, such as collective beliefs, norms,
	preferences, which interact with resources,
	opportunities, and constraints to influence
	changes in behaviour.
Context	Conditions, including cultural, social,
	historical, or institutional features, within the
	implementation setting that modify the
	behaviour of mechanisms.
Context-Mechanism-Outcome configuration	The relationship between particular contextual
(CMO)	features, particular causal mechanisms, and
	particular intended and unintended outcomes.
Program theory	A program theory describes what a program is
	expected to do and how it is expected to work,
	and includes explanations of contexts,
	mechanisms, outcomes, and their
	configurations.
