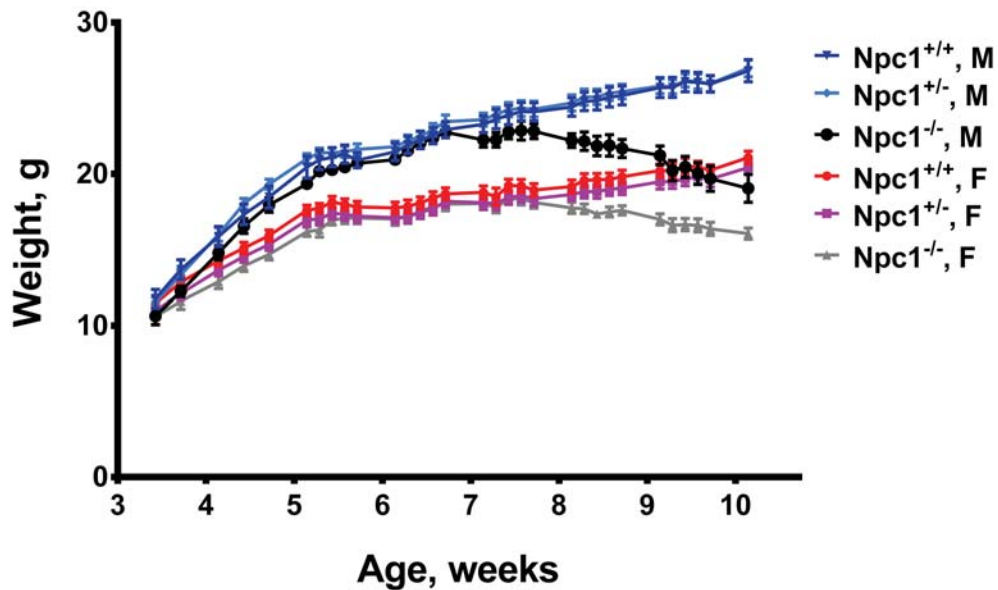


Figure S1 Body weight of *Npc1*^{+/+} ($n_{\text{female}} = 11$; $n_{\text{male}} = 7$), *Npc1*^{+/-} ($n_{\text{female}} = 15$; $n_{\text{male}} = 15$) and *Npc1*^{-/-} ($n_{\text{female}} = 9$; $n_{\text{male}} = 5$) mice from 3 – 10 weeks of age. As expected, there was a gender difference in weight, where the weight of male mice was greater than that of female mice. There was no significant difference in weight between *Npc1*^{+/+} and *Npc1*^{+/-} mice, but there was a marked weight loss in *Npc1*^{-/-} mice from 7 weeks of age onwards. Data represent mean \pm SEM.
