Interview Questionnaire:

Perceived Outcome (PO):

- 1.1. Compared with face-to-face visit, my health evaluation/diagnosis was worse during the telemedicine consultation
- 1.2. Compared with face-to-face visit, the symptom relief (health improvement) I experienced as a result of the telemedicine consultation was better
- 1.3. Compared with face-to-face visit, I felt that the physician was better able to provide me with his/her maximal effort in finding a therapeutic solution during the telemedicine consultation
- 1.4. Compared with face-to-face visit, it was harder for me to receive clinical information and explanations during the telemedicine consultation about my health
