



Figure EV1. CSF T-tau and ventricular volume.
Scatter plots showing CSF T-tau (ng/l) and ventricular volumes (ml) in different diagnostic group, separately for A β -negative (upper row) and A β -positive subjects (lower row). The plots illustrate the general observation that very high CSF T-tau levels are often seen in subjects with relatively small ventricles, independent of diagnostic group and A β status.
