<b>Type of Secondary Finding</b>	<b>Default Disclosure Procedure</b>	<b>Flexibility</b>
<p>Medically Actionable Results: Results where actions can be taken to prevent, delay, or reduce symptoms of the health condition</p>	<p>Patients are given medically actionable results that are not related to the reason for the sequencing</p>	<p>Patients have a choice: They can ask to NOT be given these results</p>
<p>Adult-Onset Conditions: Identification of changes in a child’s DNA that increases his or her risk for developing a specific health condition later in life, often in their 40s or older</p>	<p>Children and their parents are not given results for adult-onset conditions that are not related to the reason for the sequencing</p>	<p>Children and their parents have no choice: They will not be given these results even if they want them</p>
<p>Carrier Status Results: Changes in a person’s DNA that could be passed onto his or her children, but usually has no effect on the carrier</p>	<p>Patients are not given carrier status results that are not related to the reason for the sequencing</p>	<p>Patients have no choice: They will not be given these results even if they want them</p>
