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
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


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

Professor Vince Mor:

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Professor Mor’s Brown research is in a related area to that of PointRight, Inc. of which he is a founding member and in which he holds an 8% equity interest. Professor Mor’s Brown research focuses on understanding the effect of state and federal policies on the strategic choices of nursing homes and in turn, how these affect the quality of nursing home patients experience. PointRight sells information on the measurement of nursing home quality to nursing homes and liability insurers. As a founder of the company, Professor Mor helped design the quality measures that PointRight sold. While these have been modified substantially, his research and the company’s commercial activities are in the same domain.

In addition, Professor Mor Chairs the Independent Quality Committee for HRC Manor Care, Inc., a nursing home chain, for which he received compensation in the \$20,000-40,000 category. Dr. Mor also serves as chair of a Scientific Advisory Committee for NaviHealth, a post-acute care service organization, for which he also receives compensation in the \$20,000-40,000 per year category as well as stock options of .01% of equity.

Dr. Mor also serves on the Advisory Board of several research organizations and is a member of the board of directors of:

- Hospice Care of Rhode Island;
- The Jewish Alliance of Rhode Island;
- AcademyHealth.
