<b>Selection</b>	
Representativeness of the exposed cohort	a) truly representative of the average potentially resectable pancreatic cancer in the community (※) b) somewhat representative of the average potentially resectable pancreatic cancer in the community (※) c) selected group of users eg nurses, volunteers d) no description of the derivation of the cohort
