### **Reviewer Comments to Author:**

In their manuscript "eHistology image and annotation data from the Kaufman Atlas of Mouse Development" the authors describe their work of digitalizing the images of the original book published by Matthew Kaufmann (first edition as a hardcover in 1992 published by Academic Press).

The annotation technology is not new and has been used and published for other histological images. Therefore, I am not sure what the point of this manuscript is other than that this technology has been applied to a popular, previously published resource. However, that has already been reported by Graham et al in a descriptive 2015 paper in the journal Development. One of the stated reasons for publishing the manuscript is the author's concern that data published online by public institutions likes universities might become lost if funding for maintaining the resource is no longer available. However, the high-resolution scans of Kaufman's images and the annotations have also been published commercially and, therefore, this concern does not apply to this work.

As the described data and work is available for sale by Elsevier, I need to question the author's statement that "they have no competing interests in the publication" of this manuscript.
