Treatment Grade	Strength of Evidence
Grade 1	Well-designed randomized, controlled trial (RCT) that yield consistent and directly applicable results. Further research is unlikely to change the level of confidence in the estimate of effect.
Grade 2	Well-designed controlled trial without randomization, well-designed cohort or case-control analytic studies and multiple time series with or without intervention.
Grade 3	Includes observational studies with the risk for bias
Grade 4	Studies with insufficient evidence to determine the net benefits or risks.
