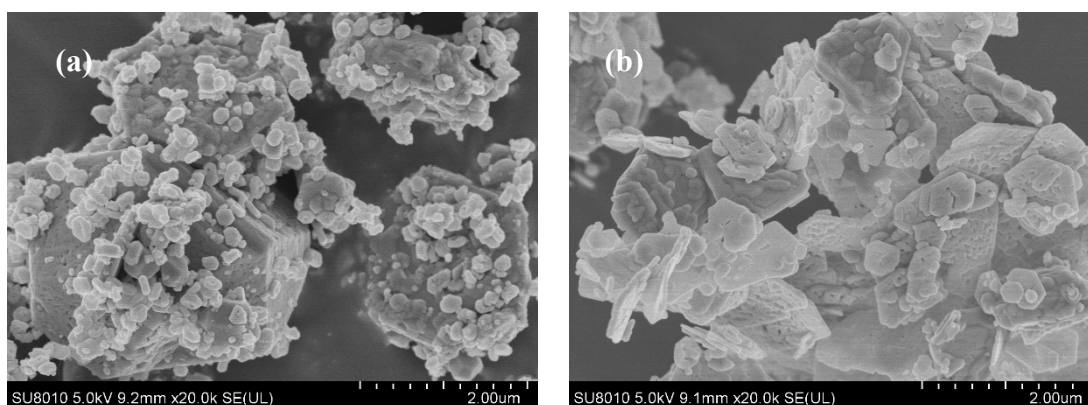

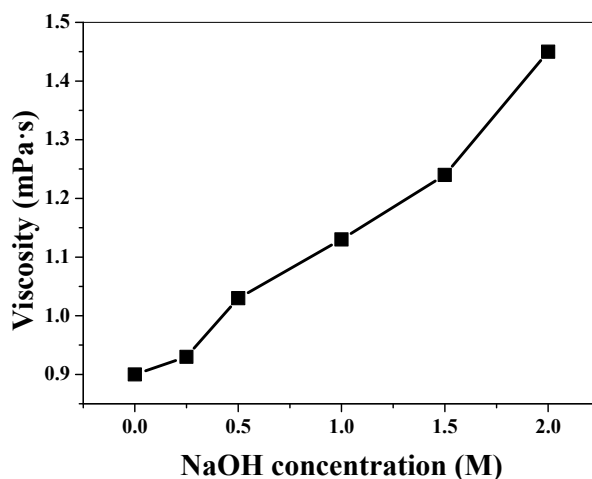


Figure S2: Effect of NaOH concentrations on the viscosity of the medium.

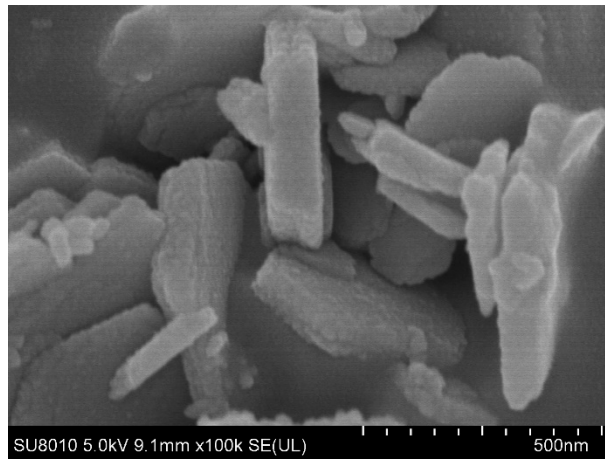


Figure S3: SEM image of the CuCo<sub>2</sub>O<sub>4</sub> nanoplatelets after catalytic reaction.
