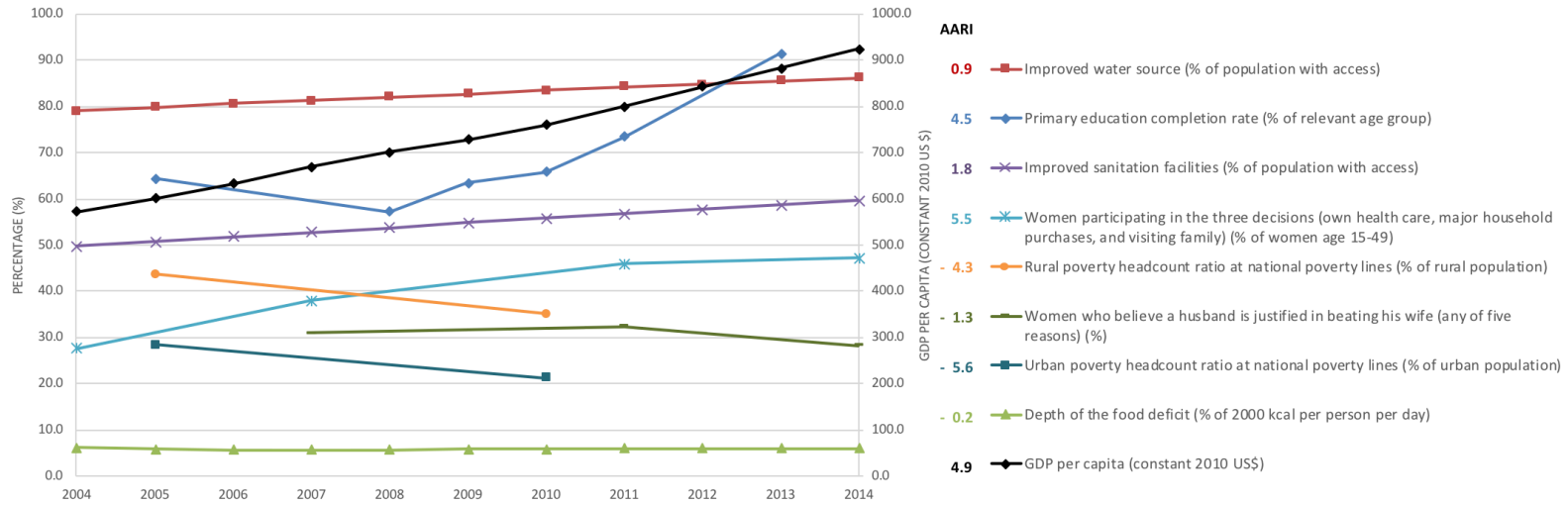
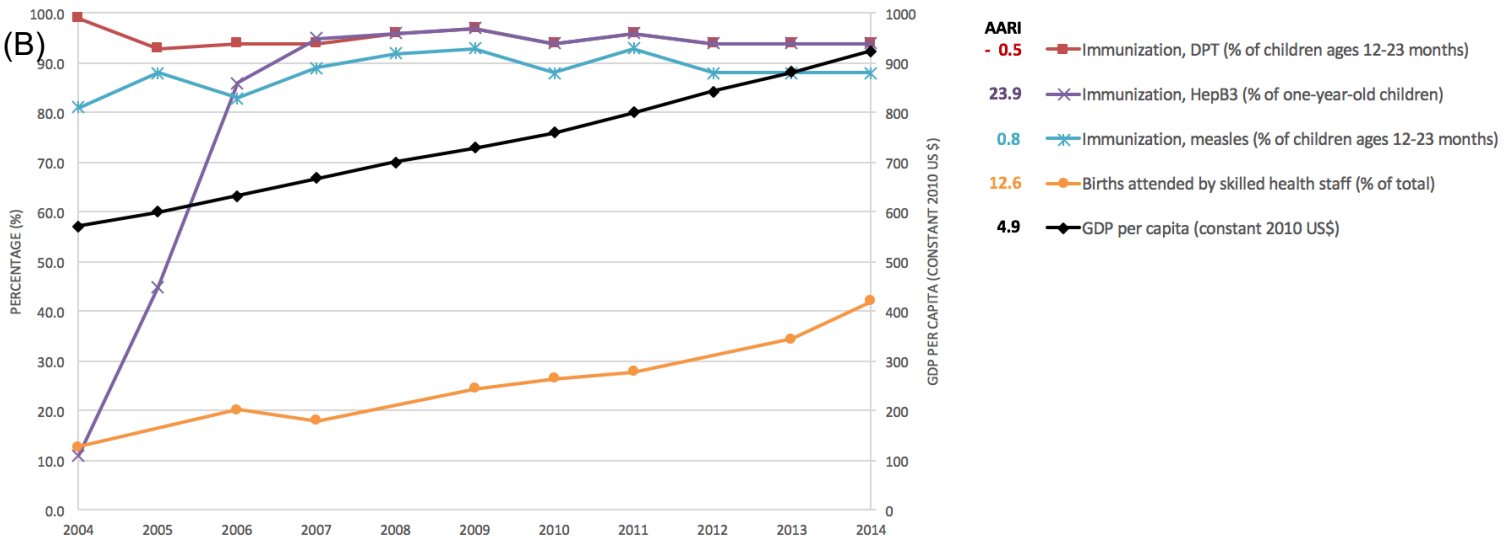


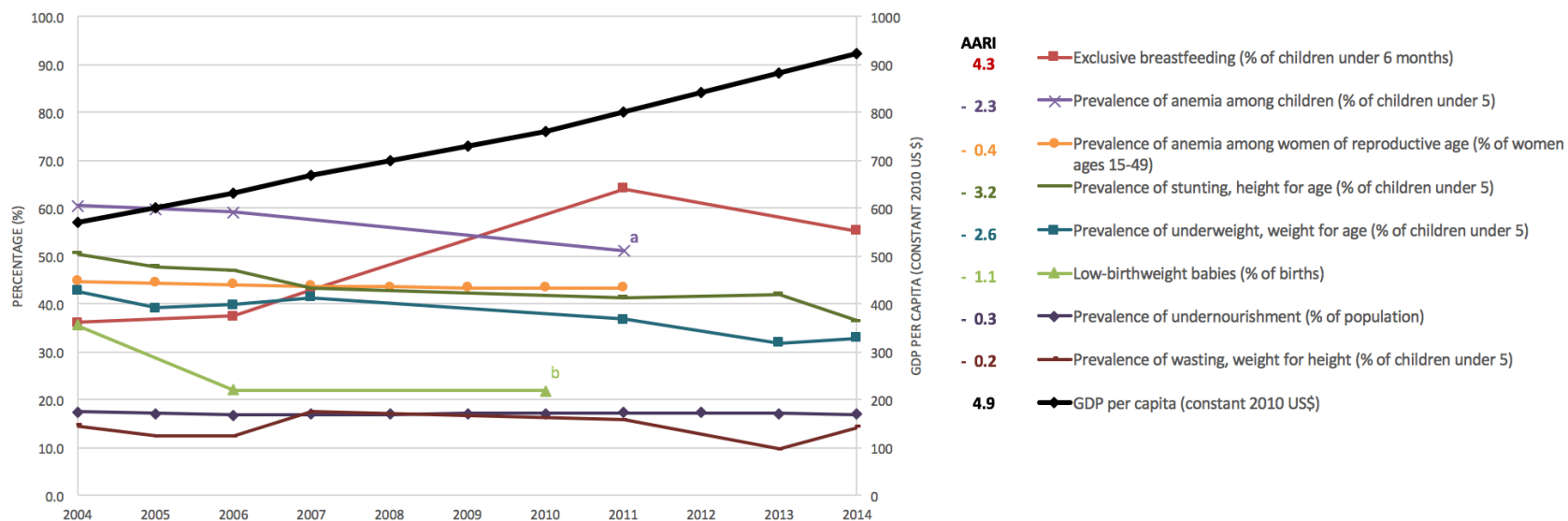

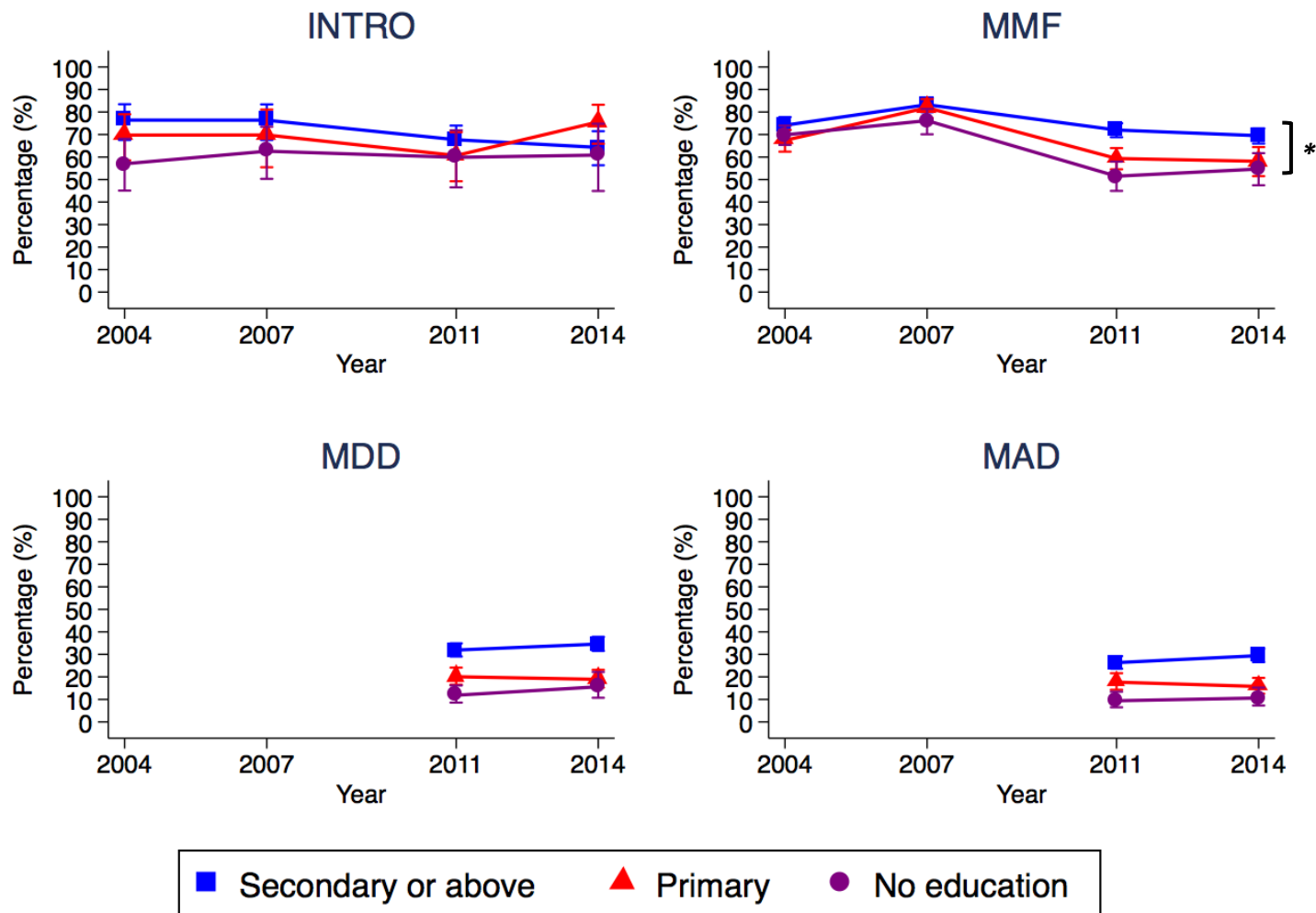

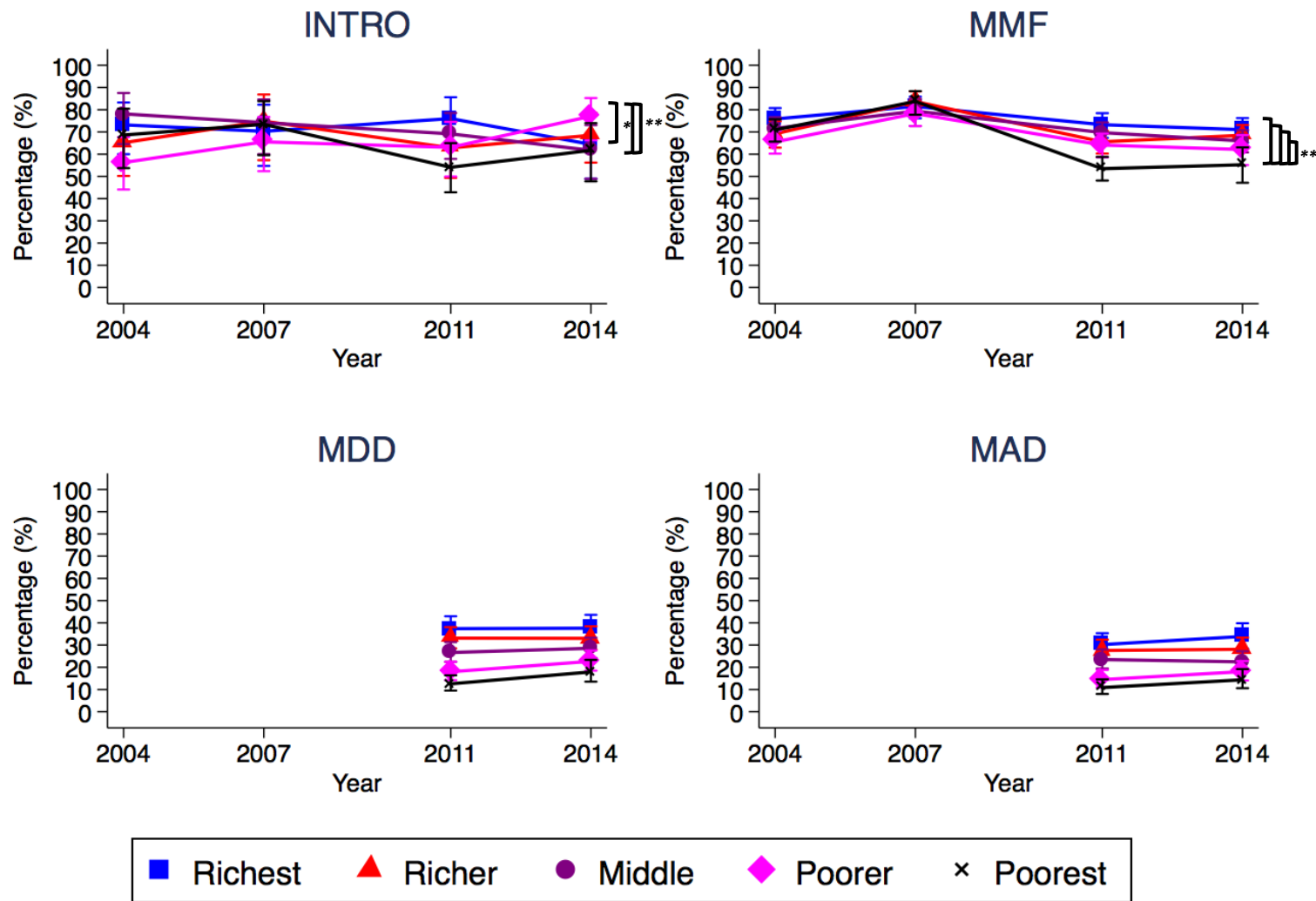

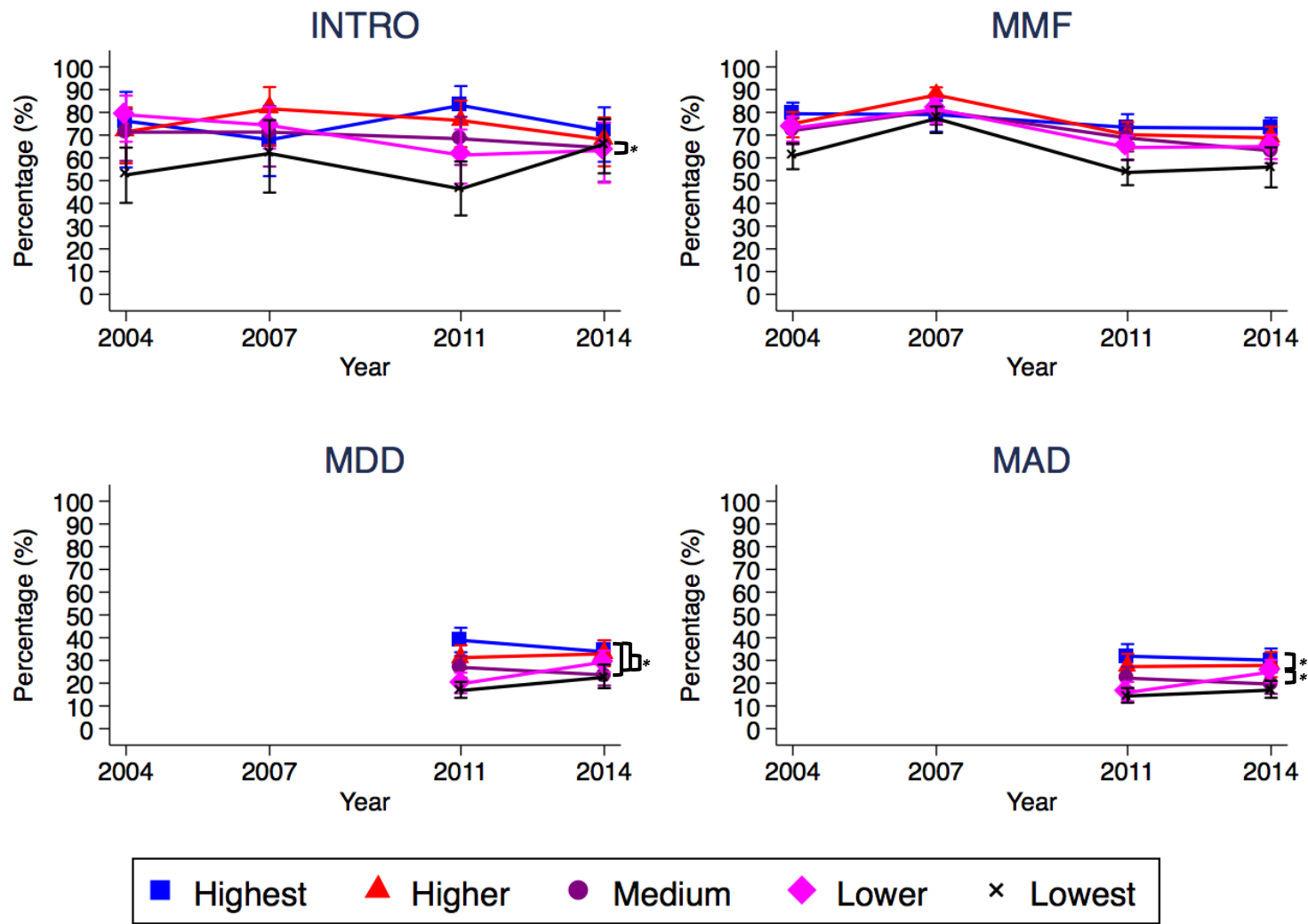

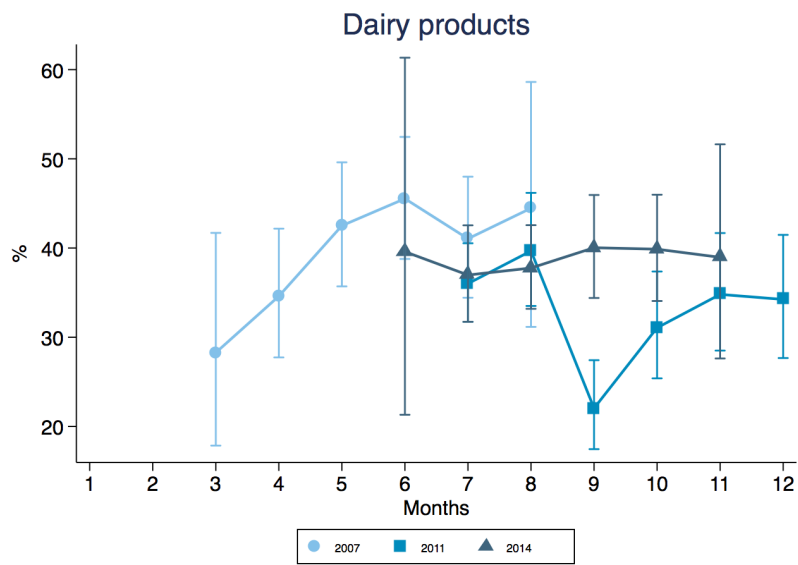
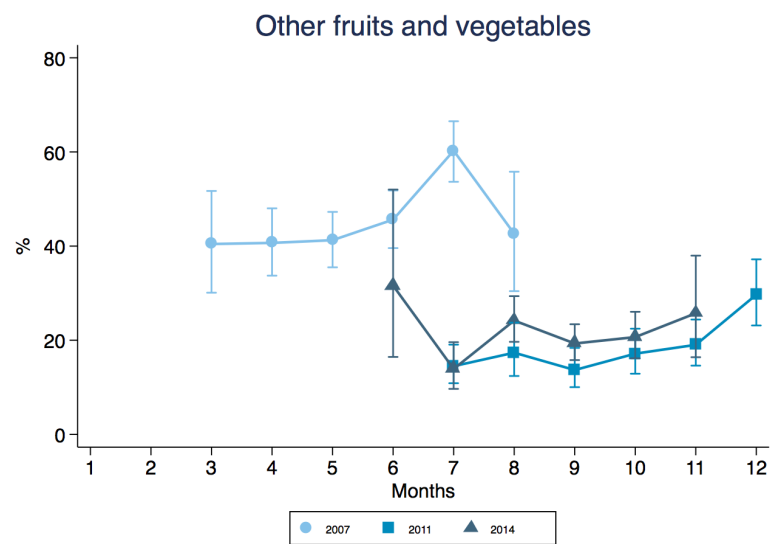
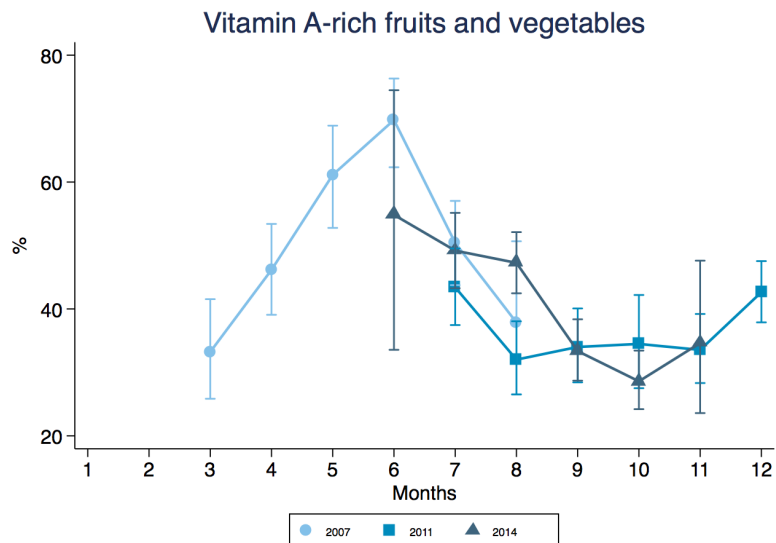
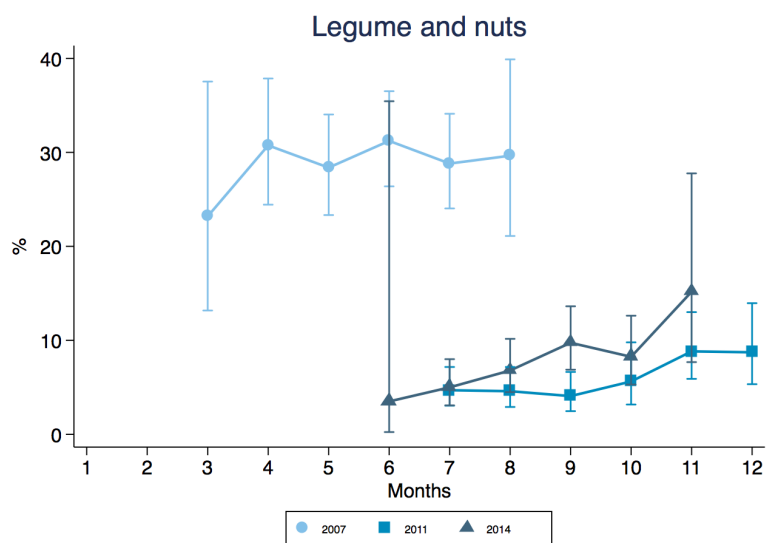
Supplemental Figure 2: Proportion of meeting complementary feeding criteria by maternal education



Supplemental Figure 3: Proportion of meeting complementary feeding criteria by household wealth

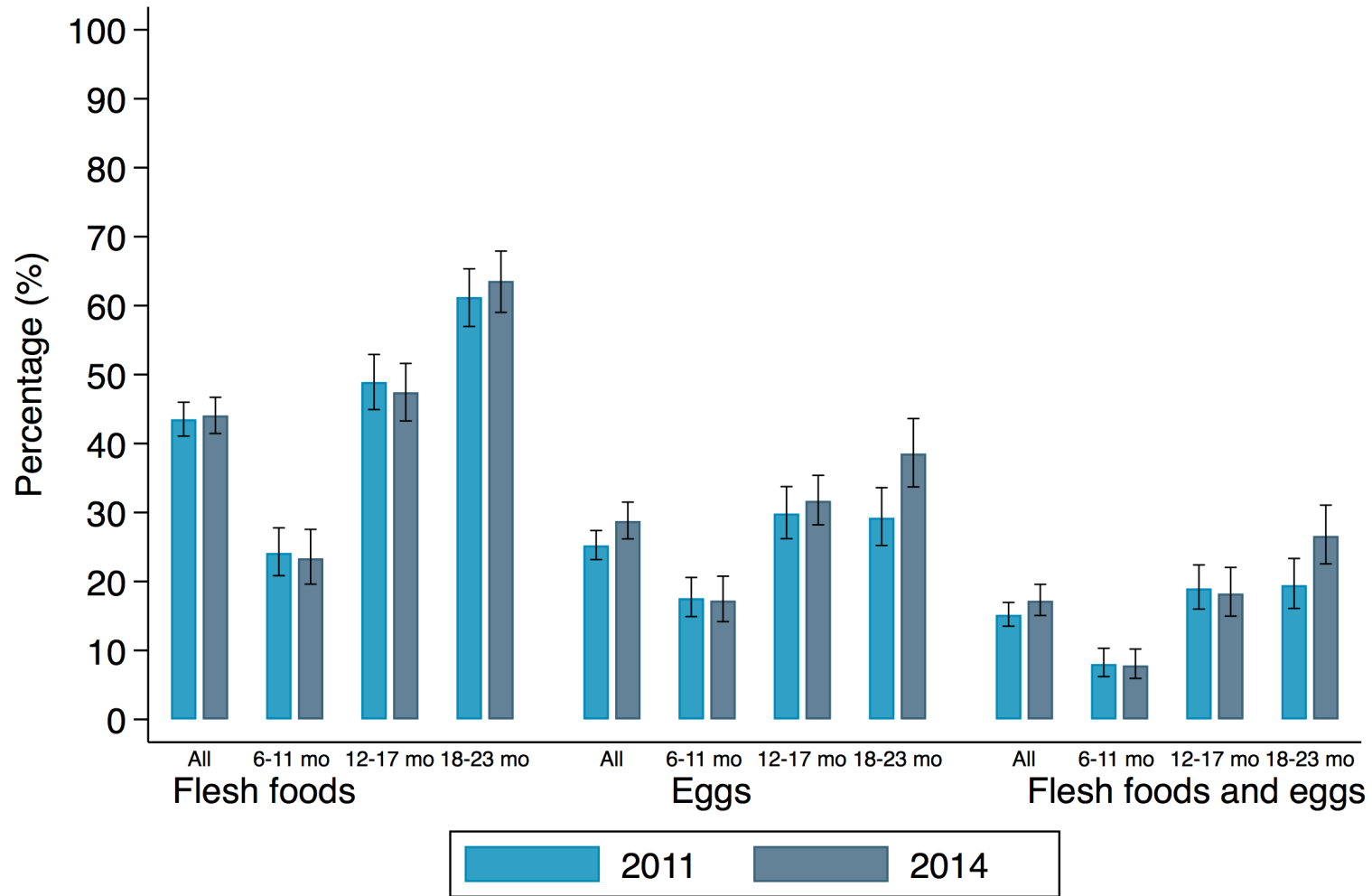


Supplemental Figure 4: Proportion of meeting complementary feeding criteria by community-level access to health care
