

Supplemental Material S1. Example script for conditioned play audiometry.

Otoscopy:

Audiologist: "Look at this light. I can see it on your hand [shine light onto child's hand]."

"I can see it on your arm [shine light onto child's arm]."

"I am going to use this light to look in your ear."

Tympanometry:

Audiologist: "Look at this [point to tympanometry tip]!"

"It's squishy/soft. You can touch it. It's going to go in your ear [puts probe in child's ear]."

"I am going to count to five and it will all be done."

Otoacoustic Emissions:

Audiologist: "Time to listen! This is squishy, too [allow child to touch probe]."

"This will go in your ear. All you have to do is listen to the music and it will all be done."

Putting on Headphones/Inserts:

Audiologist: "These are soft and will go in your ears. You can touch it [allow child to touch inserts/headphones]."

"You will hear sounds with these. The sounds won't be loud."

Word Recognition Threshold (Picture Pointing):

Audiologist: "I'm going to say some words. Touch the picture of the word you hear."

Word Recognition Threshold (Standard):

Audiologist: "I'm going to say some words. All you have to do is say the word that I say."

Pure Tone Testing:

[Audiologist models first, wearing headphones.]

Audiologist: "I'm going to listen for some beeps. When I hear a beep, I am going to put this block into the bucket" [audiologist models twice].

"Now you try, I'm going to help you first [audiologist uses hand-over-hand to train]. Now you try by yourself."
