Additional methodology regarding the collection of data on modified Rankin Scores (mRS) at baseline

The baseline mRS for each patient was determined by trained study nurses using all information available from extensive medical record review. Definitions used by study nurses are consistent with the validated mRS score and are described in the Table below. Some examples of our consistency rules are as follows: if participants use a cane they are at least a 2, but if they need help with ADLs they are assigned a 3. If participants use a walker (without a person assist) they are typically classified as a 3, but if documentation shows that they need another person for ambulation, they may be a 4.

3	Moderate disability; requiring some help, but able to walk without assistance

	attend to own bodily needs without assistance
5	Severe disability; bedridden, incontinent, and requiring constant nursing care and
