## Supplemental Table 1: Inclusion Criteria for Neonatal Respiratory ECMO at CHOA-E

- 1. Gestational age at least 34 weeks
- 2. Not more than 10 prior days of mechanical ventilation
- 3. Absence of severe underlying non-pulmonary disease (unless expected to be reversible)
- 4. Cranial ultrasound without evidence of intracranial hemorrhage greater than Grade 2
- 5. No evidence of severe brain injury (moderate HIE acceptable)
- 6. No evidence of uncontrolled bleeding or known major bleeding diathesis
- 7. Evidence of severe, refractory respiratory failure as indicated by at least one of the following:
  - a. Oxygenation index > 40 on 3 of 5 blood gases each drawn 30 to 60 minutes apart
  - b. Severe, refractory respiratory failure with sudden decompensation unresponsive to medical management
  - c. Failure to wean high ventilator settings, including failure of sustained wean from 100% oxygen after 4 or more days
  - d. 3 or more decompensation episodes requiring hand-bagging or other interventions, within a 12 hour period
- 8. Severe primary or secondary cardiac dysfunction unresponsive to other available measures
  - a. Echocardiographic evidence of severe right ventricular dysfunction
  - b. Inotropic support with VIS >30 and/or continued volume expander
