

Supplement 1: Health Risk Assessment

STANFORD PRIMARY CARE: MEDICAL RISK SCREENING

1. What is your age? (if >65 or on Medicare, go to Senior Care Triage Algorithm)

2. In general, how would you rate your current health? (alternative language....?)

“Excellent” = 0 points, “very good” = 1 pt, “good” = 2 pts, “fair” =4pts or “poor” =6pts

3. Approximately how many different prescription medications do you take regularly for ongoing conditions, not counting vitamins and over the counter medicines.

“0 meds”=0 points, “1-2 meds”=1 pts, “3-5meds ” = 2 pts, “5-7 meds” = 3 pts, or “>8 meds” = 6 points

4. Approximately how many specialists have you seen in the past year, not including for minor skin, eye, or orthopedic injuries, or routine gynecologist exams?

“0” = 0 points, “1-2” = 1pt, “3-4”=2 pts, or “>5”= 4 pts

5. Have you been hospitalized for any illness in the past year other than minor planned surgery?

CAT I: VERY LOW RISK IF TOTAL POINTS = 0-4 THEN SUGGEST VIRTUAL PCP

CAT II: ROUTINE RISK IF TOTAL POINTS = 5-11 THEN SUGGEST ROUTINE PRIMARY CARE

CAT III: HIGH RISK IF TOTAL POINTS >=12 THEN SUGGEST STANFORD COORDINATED CARE
