



STIS ARE NOT PRETTY

Common Sexually Transmitted Infections











Syphilis (STIs) (Gcushuwa) Rash, open sore, Discharge, Curable

Gonorrhea (Drop) Discharge, pain/burning Curable

Genital herpes (Blisters) Open sores, Painful blisters Treatable

Genital warts Painful bumps, Can be removed Treatable

HIV/AIDS No signs Treatable

THE FACTS


- ✔YOU CANNOT GET AIDS FROM TOUCHING, KISSING OR SHARING A KITCHEN/BATHROOM WITH A PERSON WHO HAS HIV/AIDS.
- ✔MEN CAN GIVE HIV/AIDS TO WOMEN AND WOMEN CAN GIVE HIV/AIDS TO MEN.
- ✓ PREGNANT WOMEN CAN GIVE HIV/AIDS TO THEIR UNBORN CHILD.
- ✔HIV/AIDS ATTACKS THE BODY'S ABILITY TO FIGHT DISEASES.
- ✔CONDOMS PROTECT YOU FROM GETTING HIV/AIDS.
- ✔CONDOMS BREAK IF THEY ARE USED MORE THAN ONE TIME.
- ✔ COMING INTO CONTACT WITH BLOOD, INCLUDING MENSTRUAL BLOOD, CAN EXPOSE YOU TO HIV/AIDS.
- ✔HAVING SEX WITH A VIRGIN WILL NOT CURE HIV/AIDS.
- ✔YOU CAN GET HIV/AIDS EVEN IF YOU ONLY HAVE ONE SEX PARTNER.
- ✓ WASHING AFTER SEX DOES NOT PROTECT YOU FROM HIV/AIDS.
- ✔HIV/AIDS IS NOT CAUSED BY SPIRITS OR SUPERNATURAL FORCES.
- ✓ MALE CIRCUMCISION REDUCES A MAN'S RISK OF GETTING HIV, BUT HE STILL NEEDS TO USE A CONDOM TO BE COMPLETELY PROTECTED..

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How to Use a Male Condom

Latex is Best!



Carefully open the latex condon package. Don't use your teeth, scissors, or sharp nails.



For increased sensation, place a small amount of water-based lubricant in the tip of the condom before placing it on the penis.



Pinch the tip of the condom to remove any air from the tip. Pinching the tip leaves a reservoir for semen to collect.



After the penis is erect, place the condom on the tip (head) of the penis and roll the condom to the base of the penis.



Perform "the act," whether it be oral, anal, or vaginal sex. Depending on what you're doing, you may want to hold onto the base of the condom in order to avoid slippage or breakage.



→HIV is an STI

- Fewer partners can mean fewer risks
- Know your triggers
- Plan to have safer sex
- Talk to your partner
- Use condoms
- Never use any oil / Vaseline with condoms
- Take steps toward your goal
