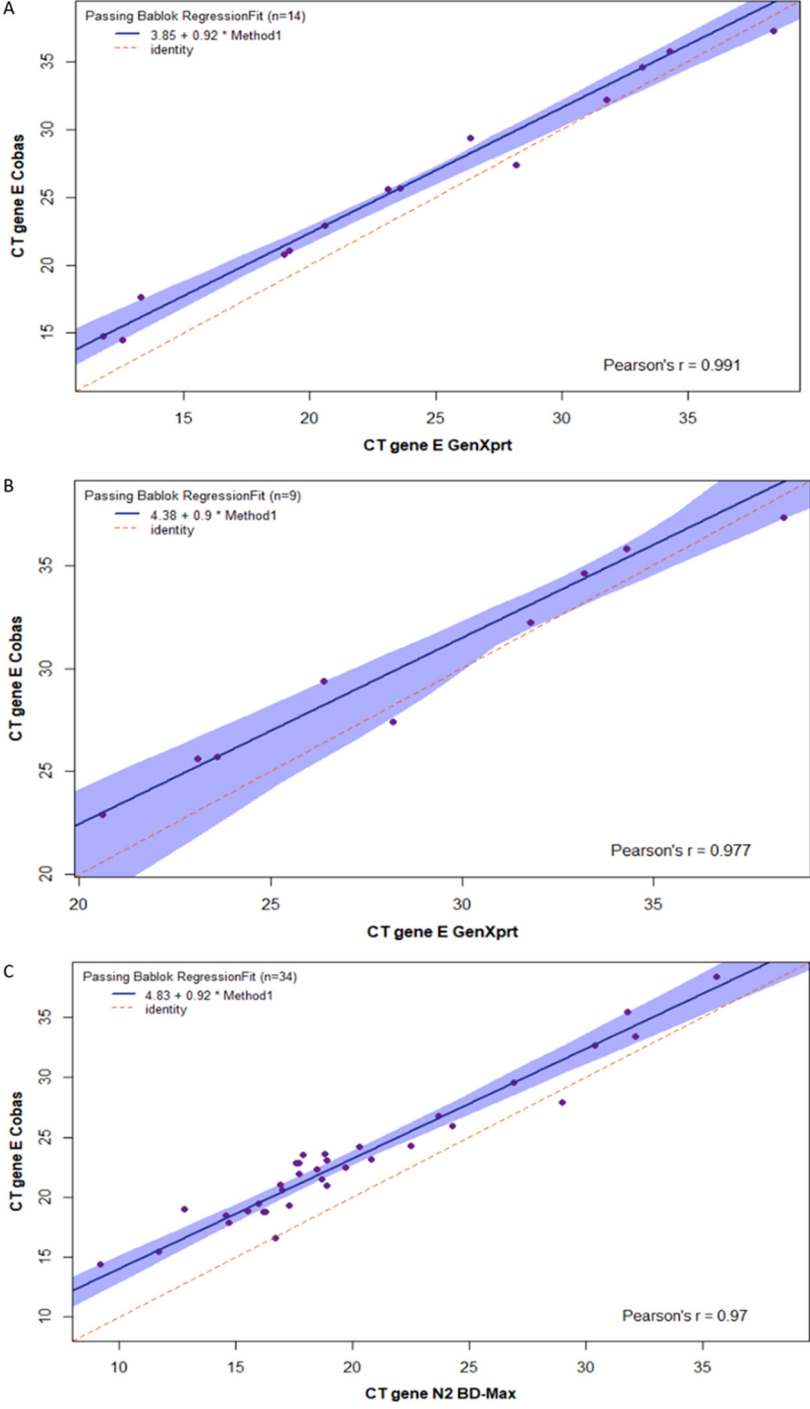

Figure S2: Changes of SARS-CoV-2 viral load over time among patients admitted between January and June 2020 according to symptoms delay.

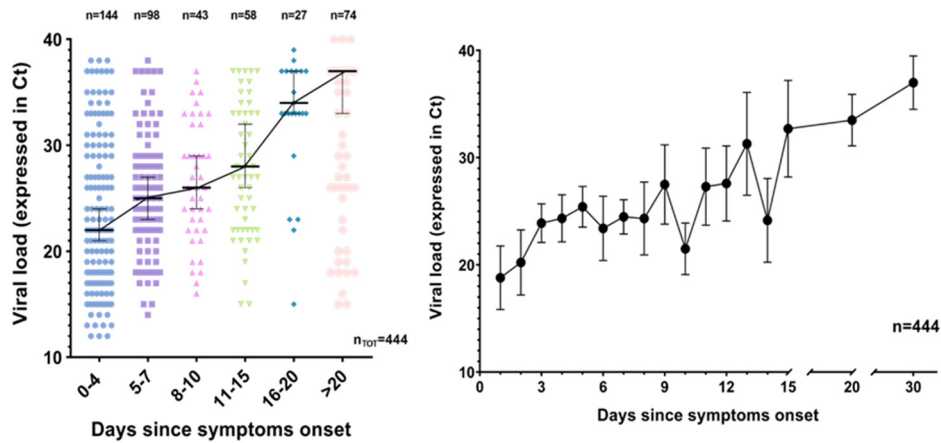
