Experiences of menstruation in high income countries: a systematic review and comparison to low- and middle-income countries

Objectives:

1. Systematically identify existing qualitative studies of experiences of menstruation in high-income countries.
2. Describe and synthesise menstrual experiences, including: management behaviours; the impact of menstruation on lives; and the factors contributing to menstrual experiences.
3. Analyse and interpret the current body of literature using thematic analyses and visual representations to draw new insights, and to contribute to the emerging conceptual frameworks of menstrual health.
4. Compare menstrual experiences in high-income countries to those in low- and middle-income countries (as detailed in Hennegan et al 2019), so as to better understand the similarities and differences
5. Compare the types of qualitative studies of menstrual experiences in high-income countries to those in low- and middle-income countries (as detailed in Hennegan et al 2019)
