Supplementary Table 2. Supplementary Table 2 shows the social determinants analysed in the papers included in this scope review on vaccination hesitancy and factors affecting seasonal influenza vaccination uptake among older people. Coloured boxes indicate that the respective determinant has been analysed in the study. Grey boxes point out those determinants that have not been considered within the article concerned. As may be seen from the table there is strong evidence around individual person-related factors that influence vaccination behaviour. Only few publications which were found due to the search strategy applied build evidence for system based-factors or political interventions to improve VU.
