Specific instances of patient influence are also included in the paper Methods and Discussion such as. including searching of the <i>Patient Experience Journal</i> and emphasising the importance of implementing organisational procedures for reimbursement and compensation.
5: Reflections / critical perspective	Comment critically on the study, reflecting on the things that went well and those that did not, so others can learn	Table 3 includes a critical analysis. Further information is included in the discussion section including Limitations.
