- How do you describe your gender identity? (i.e. Your personal concept of self as male, female, a blend of both or neither – how you perceive yourself and what you call yourself.)
 - **Non-binary and/or genderqueer:** a spectrum of gender identities that are not exclusively masculine or feminine —identities that are outside the gender binary.
 - **Transgender:** people who have a gender identity or gender expression that differs from the sex that they were assigned at birth.
 - **Agender:** also called genderless, gender-free, non-gendered, or ungendered, are those who identify as having no gender or being without a gender identity.
 - **Pangender:** a person whose gender identity is not limited to one gender and may encompass all genders at once.
 - **Two Spirit:** an umbrella term used by some Indigenous North Americans to describe Native people in their communities who fulfill a traditional third-gender ceremonial and social role in their cultures.
 - **Hijra:** a term used in some South Asian countries, meaning someone is neither completely male nor female, and which typically refers to transwomen.
 - **Questioning:** Someone in the process of exploring and discovering one’s own sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression.

 - **Bisexual:** a person attracted to both men and women, though not necessarily equally or at the same time.
 - **Asexual:** describes someone not sexually attracted to any gender.
 - **Pansexual:** describes a person attracted to those of any gender or who does not care about gender when selecting sexual partners.
 - **Queer:** a broad term that some individuals prefer, and that can be used to refer to the range of non-heterosexual and non-cisgender people.
