



Supplementary Figure S2. Cost-effectiveness acceptability curve for the chance of pregnancy leading to live birth after 12 months of follow-up for healthcare costs in the UK. The cost-effectiveness acceptability curve is shown for increasing monetary value for each *additional* live birth, with calculations from £1 to £50 000. The line indicates the probability that endometrial scratching is cost-effective at varying monetary values for each additional live birth that resulted from a pregnancy achieved within 12 months after follow-up.
