Population characteristics	Only men were included in the study. The median age was 64-65 (MDC study) and 60 (VIP study).
Recruitment	In the MDC study, men born between 1923 and 1945 living in Malmo Sweden were recruited between 1991-1996. For the VIP study, all residents of Vasterbotten County, Sweden beginning in 1985 were invited to participate at ages 40, 50, and 60.
Ethics oversight	This study was approved by the institutional review boards at Lund University and Umea University.
