Sample size	No sample-size calculation was performed for HS-AFM imaging of Snf7 on either substrate described herein. The actual sample size of HS-AFM images of Snf7 spirals on non-planar surfaces as shown in Figure 3 was increased until the total number of analyzed Snf7 spirals for each condition exceeded n=75 (see Fig. 3 caption). All experiments were performed using at least 3 different biological samples and repeated at least 3 times.
Data exclusions	Snf7 spirals that were only partially within the imaging area were excluded from analysis, because their size and morphology could not be unambiguously determined. No other data was excluded.
Replication	Plasma treatment and repetitive experimental use of non-planar surfaces presented herein introduces slight variations of surface topography between each experiment. Thus the data presented for each condition in Figure 3 represent the results of observations from several imaging areas (see Fig. 3 caption) acquired during single experiments on different days and with different HS-AFM tips. Representative Snf7 spiral buckling events were observed in separate HS-AFM experiments performed on different days.
Randomization	This study did not allocate experimental groups. No randomization was required for the reported experiments.
Blinding	This is a molecular biophysics / structural biology study followed by computational data analysis - no blinding was required for this study. Blinding was not required for the reported experiments, all data were analyzed using the same computational methods.
