


Supplemental Figure 1. Diagram of study flow





Notes: ¹Research assistants #1 and #2 (one male and female) were positioned at Recruitment station. All passersby were asked if they were interested in participating in a study about intoxication and social interactions. Interested passersby were moved to the Informed Consent station; interested passersby in groups were separated such only one individual completed each study component at a time.

²At the Informed Consent station, research assistant #3 read aloud informed consent while participants read written documentation.

³At the Vignette station, a gender-matched research assistant (research assistants #4 and 5) read each item aloud and clarified scale anchor points. Participants recorded their responses to each item on their form privately.

⁴ Research assistant #6 was positioned at the Debriefing station.
