Infant	<p>Eight women delivered a child with a congenital anomaly (0.8%)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Anal atresia, vaginal septum and neurogenic bladder with vesico-ureteric reflux, underwent successful surgery• Bilateral ear malformations with hearing loss• Giant omphalocele, deceased• EBSTEIN anomaly, deceased• Multiple congenital anomalies (penoscrotal hypospadias, cerebral ventriculomegaly and suspected growth hormone deficiency), development delay• Congenital melanocytic nevus, which covered the majority of the lower back to right thigh and inguinal regions, follow-up at paediatrician• Transposition of the great arteries with ventricular septal defect, underwent successful surgery• Bronchogenic cyst, underwent successful surgery
Maternal	<p>One ectopic pregnancy needing a laparoscopic unilateral salpingectomy One ectopic pregnancy treated with methotrexate One cardiac arrest after spinal anaesthesia administered for caesarean section, uncomplicated recovery One breast cancer, needing treatment with unknown recovery One lymphoma, needing treatment with unknown recovery</p>
