Understanding and Experiencing Power Differentials Recognizing and Experiencing Social Determinants of Health	Interactive exercises to experience and appreciate the power differentials between healthcare professionals and patients and families from underserved communities.
CBPR: History, Philosophy, Balancing Social Justice and Research	Recognizing social action focus of CBPR, the principles of balancing research with the goal of enhancing outcomes for the communities we serve, and full and equal partnership with the community.
Developing Partnership with The Community Advisory Board	Principles of appointing, partnering, and developing trust with a Community Advisory Board comprised of members from the community who have experienced disparities in receipt of palliative care, community leaders, and healthcare providers.
Focus Groups Principles and Practice	Focus group principles on recruiting community members from underserved communities, creating a safe place for community members to share their experiences with palliative and end-of-life care, the cultural values and care and communication preferences this community cares about, and their lived experiences of bias and racism.
Thematic Analysis	Methods for analyzing the key themes that emerge from the focus groups.
Building the Palliative Care Intervention in Partnership with the Community Advisory Board	In full partnership with the Community Advisory Board, and based on the results from the focus groups, working to design equitable palliative care programs for this community, e.g., developing training programs for palliative care clinicians who provide care for patients from this community.
Planning the Next Steps and Sustainability with the Community Advisory Board	Following the design of the equitable palliative care program, planning with the Community Advisory Board the next steps for the implementation, dissemination, and sustainability of this program.
